Prayer Concerns

Litany for the Ministry to Black Boys

Minister: The African-American community and family are suffering because too many of our boys never make it into Unashamedly Black and Unapologetically Christian Manhood.

Congregation: We affirm that this is a crisis that warrants our prayerful attention.

Minister: The Bible says, in Proverbs 22:6, "Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it."

Congregation: We affirm the wisdom of this scripture.

Minister: The African Proverb says that "It takes a whole village to raise a child."

Congregation: We affirm the wisdom of this proverb from our Motherland.

Minister: Isuthu means "Coming into Manhood" in Xhosa, the mother tongue of Nelson Mandela, and it is the name of our Rites of Passage Ministry to our boys and parents.

Congregation: We affirm the presence of the Isuthu Ministry in our Village.

Minister: The Men of Isuthu have accepted God's call to mentor our boys from "maleness to manhood."

Congregation: We affirm the men who have accepted this sacred task and we call for more men to join them.

Minister: Hearing this call, we invite other men of Trinity who are willing and supportive to join the men of Isuthu at this altar for prayer.

Minister: Lord, we pray as a community of faith, for the inspiration and strengthening of the men of Trinity United Church of Christ so that they will move towards committed involvement in Isuthu and in the lives of young Black males who need this outpouring of love and support to save them from psychological, spiritual, and even physical death at an early age.

Congregation: Lord, hear our prayer.

Minister: Lord, we pray that the ranks of the Isuthu Ministry will be increased with men who are committed to Christ, Culture, and Community and that young Black males who are hungry for the love and wisdom of these men would also come forward.

Congregation: Lord, hear our prayer.

All: Lord, strengthen our resolve and help us be steadfast in our commitment made this day to continue in prayer and support for both the Men of Isuthu and the boys they serve going forward.

Minister: Let the Church say, Amen!

All: Amen!







SLAVERY IN MAURITANIA

Today, in the year 2014, slavery still exists in the world. Mauritania, located in West Africa, has the highest percentage of enslaved people in the world. More people are enslaved, percentagewise, in Mauritania today, than were enslaved in the United States prior to the Civil War in 1860.

Mauritania's slavery is as abusive and violent today, as American slavery was 150 years ago. Children are sold away from their families, women and girls are raped, and all are beaten.

Mauritanian slavery is based on race and descent. Dark Africans are enslaved by lighter Africans and persons of Arabic descent. Slavery is inter-generational, with many people being born into slavery because their parents were slaves.
