EBOLA – The word strikes fear in the minds of the masses, in Africa, where they have been dealing with the current crisis since March, and in America, where the fear outpaces the reality.

Last Friday, Vickie Casanova Willis, the member of our Justice Watch Team whose focus is on Africans in Diaspora, received an email from a classmate, the Honorable Edward Forh, a member of the Liberian House of Representatives, and PhD student at Walden University. In that email he described his county as having the highest number of ebola cases in Liberia, and Liberia as struggling with the highest number of ebola cases in the world – over 1,082 cases and over 624 deaths – nearly half of the global total, acording to the World Health Organization.

Brother Edward put forth a plea for help.

While the world is grappling with the worst outbreak of Ebola in our history and providing various levels of support to areas in need, this personal request is focused on specific needs, and in fact included a list of supplies. In response, Vickie is now leading a Task Team to both provide information and education to our congregation and beyond, and to determine how to support the supply needs that have been expressed.
