Leading is Fundamental

The Washington Heights community is at a tipping point. As you know, in late November 2013, the Endeleo Institute spearheaded a community-led effort to restore the Carter G. Woodson Regional Library. Roughly 40 residents braved the cold and made the trip downtown to help make the case to the Chicago Public Library Board for a 21st century library to not only strengthen community, but to empower it.

In December, 2015 the City of Chicago sent notice through the Alderman’s office of a community meeting, providing only one day’s notice to outline the hiring process, procurement and construction timelines. Despite the city’s tactics, the meeting was well-attended and residents voiced their displeasure and insisted that city representatives reconvene another meeting in January.

With an estimated \$10M budget, Endeleo is proposing that the city enter into a **Community Benefits Agreement (CBA)**, a legally-binding (and enforceable) tool executed between one or more community-based organizations that represent individuals and groups affected by a proposed development and one or more developers. The CBA is intended to outline the developers’ commitment to provide a range of community benefits and Endeleo is seeking to be the lead partner for the other interested community organizations, churches, and stakeholders.

Such an agreement would set a precedent in this much-maligned city, in that it obligates the developer(s) to facilitate the vision of the public and provide it a more strategic role. This is significant when considering the social and cultural impact of Woodson, its treasured Vivian Harsh Collection, and connections to Trinity UCC. Still, the most important aspect of winning a CBA is having an organized power base which includes residents, neighborhood block clubs, churches, and community-based organizations. The greatest of CBA proposals will go nowhere unless people are organized enough to make decision-makers take note.

The next library community meeting is scheduled to take place later this month. Restoring our library is a social justice issue in Washington Heights and your voice is critically important to completely change the narrative. We already have the power and authority; all we need is you. Please stay tuned.

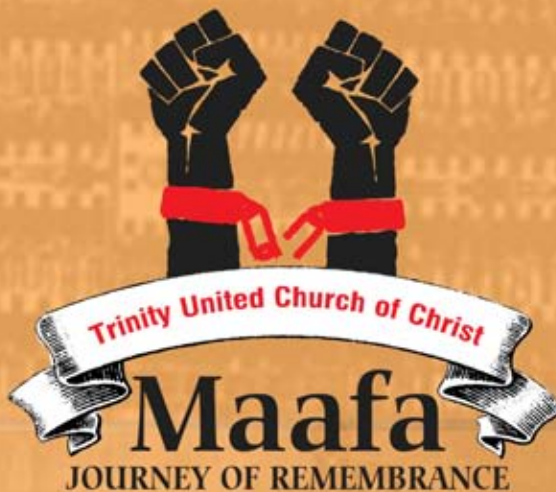
November – Service One Another
