

- Scroll down to the 3rd rectangle that says, "OK! LET'S GET STARTED!"
- Click on "Start the Online Voter Registration Application." This process takes about 15 – 20 minutes.

TO VOTE IN ILLINOIS:

- You must be a United States Citizen
- You must be 17-years-old on or before the date of the Primary Election and turn 18 on or before the date of the General Election
- You must live in your election precinct at least 30 days prior to Election Day
- Not be convicted and in jail
- Not claim the right to vote anywhere else




