Alerts

- We are working on a temporary heating solution for the Sanctuary that will be in place by December 3rd. Can we get an Amen!?!
- The new heating and air-conditioning equipment is being constructed and installed during December, both the permanent solution for the Sanctuary, and for the office area and Atrium/Fellowship Hall
- In December, work will also be beginning on new floors in the Atrium, Fellowship Hall, and the halls near rooms 116, 120, etc. This reduces our spaces for activities and events. Ministries are encouraged to seek outside meeting spaces. Member and Guest Services are available to assist you as needed.



Construction Activity Over the Next Two Weeks

Concrete - complete east concrete (including curbs, warning tiles, seat wall, bench pads, patio door pad, etc.).

Landscaping - complete landscaping (including out cropping's (boulders), remaining plants, patio stone & river-rock, sod, etc.)

Roofing/HVAC - Set Roof Top Units curbs (requires reoccurring roof opening and closing in 8 different locations; will attempt to keep moisture penetration to a minimum. Prep ductwork to accept new units. Reseal roofing.



November is National Family Caregivers Month and National Alzheimer's Disease Awareness Month Theme for Caregivers' Month: "Take Care to Give Care"

Caring for ill family members and loved ones can lead to a higher risk of health issues among the nation's 90 million family caregivers. Only by taking care of yourself can you be strong enough to take care of your loved one(s).

In America, there are 15 million caregivers taking care of someone with Alzheimer's and other dementias.

- About 2/3 of caregivers of people with Alzheimer's and other dementias are women.
- Over 1/3 of dementia caregivers are daughters
- Among primary caregivers of people with dementia 55% take care of parents.
- 23% of Alzheimer's disease or dementia caregivers are "sandwich generation" caregivers, meaning that they care not only for an aging parent, but also for children under age 18.

Tips for caregivers:

- Find time for yourself
- Know what resources are available
- Educate yourself about caregiving
- Get help and find support
- Make legal and financial plans
- Manage your stress
- Take care of yourself
- Know that you are doing your best
- Accept changes as they occur
- Visit your doctor regularly

"I didn't see a whole lot of people who looked like me doing it on television but you get used to being underestimated." ~Gwen Ifill, groundbreaking journalist who died earlier this month at 61 Just a few words about a woman who knew her way around them. The passing of Gwen Ifill, one of the world's most respected journalists is still a shock and feels like losing a family member. Tributes to this

African American trailblazer poured in from colleagues and regular viewers who have long enjoyed her candor and no-nonsense flair for both political reporting and anchoring PBS's *NewsHour*.

What is most impressive about Gwen's incredibly distinguished career was how she blazed a trail where none existed. As the *New York Times* stated in her obituary, "Ms. Ifill was at the forefront of a journalism vanguard as a Black woman in a field dominated by white men." There was no map, so she created one. This is exactly what we tell young people at Endeleo. If you're waiting on someone to tell you what to do, you're already at a disadvantage.

So, we salute this extraordinary journalist, anchor, moderator, and true media friend. Rest.
